# Drivers of public financing for basic education

- School Age-Pop.: 32.8 Million (30% of HH pop.)
- Enrollment, Public Schools: 22.9 Million (Private: 3.2 Mn)
- Schools, Public: 47,612 (Private: 12,861)
- Classroom-Student ratio: 1:43
- Public School Teachers: 876,842, of which:
  - Teachers: 808,571
  - Master Teachers: 59,972
  - Special Education (SPED) Teachers: 4,882




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#### The Special Education Fund (SEF)


- A Local Government Unit (LGU) fund earmarked for education
- Collected with the Real Property Tax
- Total collection, all LGUs (2018): P 32.98 Billion
- ~5% of total LGU income\
- Administered by the Local School Board (LSB)



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#### SEF per capita (student), by region, in Pesos




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# National (Dept. of Education) MOOE per capita (student), in Pesos




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#### Per capita allotment, sum of DepEd MOOE and SEF




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## Public financing for basic education, 2018/2019, in Billion Pesos





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### 2022 law (R.A. 11650) mandates education inclusion and services for children with disabilities

To date, no implementing rules and regulations have been issued

 "Child –find" – early identification of disabilities among children

- Inclusive Learning Resource
  Centers facilities and equipment
- Special needs teachers and supervisors
- Modest allocations included in DepEd budget for 2023



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#### Batangas Province: Local ordinance

- Adopts the "Gabay" program piloted by USAID:
  - Screening and identification of children with disabilities
  - Referral to medical and special education centers
  - Establishment of Inclusive Education Resource Centers
- Tasks the Local School Board to allocate an annual budget from the SEF to educate children with disabilities



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
