The RAPID Framework is designed to tackle the learning losses caused by the pandemic. It is based on five evidence-based policy actions: (1) Reach all children; (2) Assess learning; (3) Prioritize the fundamentals, (4) Increase the efficiency of instruction, and (5) Develop psychosocial health and wellbeing. Featuring a menu of policy options as well as resources, country examples and considerations for implementation, the framework will help education authorities make decisions needed to recover and accelerate learning.
